

## National Curriculum for Languages

Pupils will be taught to:

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words
- Engage in conversations
- Speak in sentences using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures
- Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation
- Present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences
- Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing
- Appreciate stories, songs, poems, and rhymes in the language
- Broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words
- Write phrases from memory and adapt these to create new sentences
- Describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing
- Understand basic grammar

## Marking & Feedback

- Feedback must follow the agreed school policy.
- Marking must occur before the next lesson so that pupils can respond and react to the marking
- Next step marking must be provided.

## Monitoring

- Book looks and lesson observations will be carried out by the subject leader.

## Learning

- Children in KS2 will have a 30 minute French lesson per week.
- Children will have opportunities to interact with visual, audio and kinaesthetic prompts during their lessons.

## Assessment

- Formative assessment will take place and will be used to support learning and inform future planning.
